We Work as One


WE HEAL AS ONE

TRAINING MANUAL FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS IN THE PHILIPPINES VIRTUAL VALIDATION MEETING WITH PARTNERS

Forensic The National Training Institute (NFSTI) has once again participated in continuous development in the creation of training manual on HIV service Provision for People who inject drugs (PWID) and People deprived of liberty and living with HIV and (PDLHIV): A Training Manual for Law Enforcement Officers in the Philippines. The training manual was first introduced last September 2019 in Tagaytay City and re-validated in December 2019 at Novotel Hotel in Quezon City. The United Nations Officer on Drugs and Crimes (UNODC) has organized final online consultation on the manual last May 29, 2020 for fine tuning. Mr. Olivier Lermet, Senior Policy Advisor, UNODC gave his opening remarks and official start the discussions. Ms. Sheila Marquez, moderated the online meeting. The participants actively gave their thoughts and insights to make it responsive, accurate and impactful to the law enforcers of the country. NFSTI's Mr. Vergel O. Santiago and Mr. Hernan G. Regino are the two key contributors in the development of manual in the Philippine context. The team is looking forward to roll-out the manual in the nearest future adapting the new normal in the delivery of trainings and education.





The manual has passed through a rigorous and tedious process involving stakeholders from key law enforcement agencies such as the Philippine National Police (PNP), Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP), and learning institutions under the umbrella of the PNP such as Philippine National Police Academy (PNPA), National Police College (NPC), National Forensic Science Training Institute (NFSTI), and Philippine Public Safety College (PPSC); Philippine Drugs Enforcement Agency (PDEA), PDEA Academy, Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), and the United Nations Office of Drugs and Crime (UNODC).

"I am the current Presiding Judge of Branch 98 and the concurrent Acting Presiding Judge of Branch 97, Regional Trial Court of Quezon City. In my early years as a trial court judge, I made myself realize the challenges that a woman judge could face in deciding cases given the adversarial nature of the work in the judiciary, which was made even more difficult by the challenges of working in a maledominated profession. But through my conviction and passion about the rule of law, I refused to be put down, pushed aside, or told that I don't belong at the table.

In 2004, while I was driving along EDSA, two men aboard on a vehicle blocked the road, one of them alighted from the vehicle, approached me casually, and then poked his gun on my head. At that very moment, my vulnerability was at the core of my difficult emotion. But then, it was also the moment that made me stronger and more determined. It helped me open my eyes that a women is the master of her own fate.

Fight Agains

The National Forensic Science Training Institute is in full protection of its staff and students against COVID19. As such, precautionary measures and collaborations were laid-off with stern compliance.

The Institute attended two meetings with the PNP-PRO4 CALABARZON to discuss NFSTI's measures in preventing the transmission of the virus and Camp Vicente Lim's protocol in handling COVID 19 patients. Likewise, PRO4A solicited suggestions on how to further enhance protection of Camp Vicente Lim against COVID 19. NFSTI suggested to restrict people from nearby barrio in entering the camp.

The NFSTI shared its measures and practices against COVID19. Constitutive Units and PRO4A made a critique/ observations on how offices are doing i.e. not observing social distancing for ITG, food supplies, etc. On the second meeting, PNP-PRO4A provided an update on the protocols being implemented in the Camp.

To avoid physical contact, the C. RAAD/ Admin has made a phone-call to stay-in personnel (staff, students, security head guard) of NFSTI to discuss additional measures against COVID 19. Specifically, C,RAAD/Admin discussed that staff and students (including mess hall staff) are no longer allowed to get outside the NFSTI compound. Any staff and students who wish to go out the NFSTI compound will be allowed but will NOT NO LONGER BE allowed to go back. It was highlighted that only 2 NFSTI staff will buy foods for stay-in staff and students using NFSTI van. Purchase of food should be done twice a week. NFSTI van should be disinfected prior entering the NFSTI compound. Likewise, the Institute made Clorox and water solutions as alternative for alcohol.

A total of 4 rounds of misting and disinfecting of NFSTI facilities was conducted along with **strict compliance** on measures and rules regarding Camp Vicente Lim's total lock down status.



Twenty (20) NFSTI staff were tested negative for COVID19 through SARS-CoV-2 IgM/IgG Antibody Assay Kit conducted last, June 11, 2020 at PRO4A Health Service.



The Institute is religiously sending the NFSTI Daily Monitoring Report to PPSC TG COVID starting March 16 to date. In addition, the NFSTI COVID19 IMPLAN has been submitted to PRO4A—Regional Health Service.

The Philippine Public Safety College (PPSC) has adapted the Flexible Learning Management System (FLMS) which includes the deployment of Virtual or e-Learning platform, capable of Synchronous and Asynchronous modality of Teaching and Learning Experience (TLA) that will help meet the challenges and demands of Blended, Hybrid, and Individualized Teaching and Learning Experience. The purpose of the system is to continuously provide unhampered delivery of quality education and training for all students-officers from PNP, BFP and BJMP.

FLMS is also projected to enrich the students' intellectual journey and maximize their competencies while demonstrating the resilient and adaptive capacity of PPSC in pursuing its mandate under the "new normal" condition.

Pursuant to the IATF Guidelines and PPSC Academic Board Resolution Number 2020-01 the Director, NFSTI directed the Academic Board to deliberate the conduct of CRIDEC classes affected during the community quarantine to align with the guidelines provided by the COVID-19 Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF).

The Blended Learning Approach is implemented for all lecture and practical exercise components under the CRIDEC Program of Instruction. All lecture components is done through options provided to the trainees such as, distance and self-paced learning, teaching and learning through asynchronous and synchronous platforms.

All practical exercises (PE), however, is scheduled until such time face-to-face instruction may be allowed.

CRIDEC Blended

Master Training Schedules is adjusted based on the mode of learning per subject. One Subjects are scheduled for online consultation to supplement the self-paced learning. Self-paced learning is executed by using the CRIDEC Standard Learning Packages (SLPs) as main instructional material in accordance to the Flexible Learning Management System guidelines by the PPSC. Online access to the SLPs is maintained by the CSDU.

Online consultation is the avenue for student-teacher interaction for the lecture component and is executed by allotting a minimum of 2-hour online conference through preferred synchronous platforms. This is supported by a subscription to an online learning platform.

While distance and self-paced learning may be done for lectures, a face-to-face assessment of skills is critical for the Practical Exercises (PE) component under the CRIDEC POI. With this, PEs is scheduled a face-to-face class by recommendation of the RAAD still observing IATF provisions.


All official announcements regarding classes shall be directed by the RAAD coursed through the Course Coordinator of each company to monitor both student and teacher activities via all available mode of communication.

In order to ensure the highest transfer of knowledge to the students via e-learning, the Institute is conducting faculty accreditation/re-accreditation and re-tooling.

Faculty members will be given a hands-on training by NFSTI on the selected online learning systems and are expected to deliver and execute the assigned subjects

effectively when necessary.
