The ribbon cutting was led by the PPSC President PLTGEN RICARDO F. DE LEON (Ret), MPSA, Ph.D., with his loving wife DR. ANGELES T. DE LEON, MD, DPBA, MHSA, MMHA, MHA. It was witnessed by other PPSC and NFSTI key officials. After the ribbon cutting, REV. FR. PCOL RONILO A DATU, Chief, Chaplain, PRO4A, blessed the facilities.

The initiative is marched towards innovation and digital transformation through the C.A.R.I.N.G. Strategy, which the PPSC President began. As a step towards a secure and tranquil digital era of public safety, the NFSTI provided the first formal course study of digital forensics in the Philippines last December. The National Forensic Science Training Institute (NFSTI) Digital Forensic Laboratory is a specialized area to work where the students can engage in computer-related crime cases, digital data exploration, identification analysis, and digital evidence storage. Its goal is to assist future investigators in identifying, acquiring, and interpreting digital data. After the welcome remarks, a digital launching of the Digital Forensic Investigation Course (DFIC) logo was officially launched. It was immediately followed by a quick message from Mr. Ruck Edmund Del Rosario, the Digital Forensic expert. In his speech, he was grateful that PPSC-NFSTI had taken the initiative to establish a digital forensic laboratory as the country is already behind in digital investigation. Mr. Del Rosario looks forward to the laboratory growing and catering to a more significant portion of society. This is a good start, Mr. Del Rosario said.

As the program's highlight, the President, PLTGEN RICARDO F. DE LEON, MPSA, Ph.D., gave his inspirational message to the guests. He highlighted that the program is part of a strengthened and expanded digital forensic investigation for immediate identification of criminals and rapid processing of evidence from crimes such as rape, pornography, cyber-attacks, and hacking. It will also help increase the knowledge and skills of our authorities and agencies in combating various cyber issues in our country. It will also assist in monitoring possible digital threats from inside to outside the country. Under the supervision of the Philippine Public Safety College and the National Forensic Science Training Institute, it is also studying the relationship with universities and colleges in the country to make it part of their subject matter.



TAKING QUALITY, A HABIT: THE ISO 9001:2015 ON DOCUMENT CONTROL

Selected NFSTI staff attended the "How to become an Effective ISO 9001:2015 Document Controller" seminar last April 22, 2022, initiated by the Department of Trade and Industry-Philippine Trade Training Center

- Global MSME Academy (DTI-PTTC-Global MSME Academy). Deputized Document Controllers, namely lan Mark D. Martin, Hernan G. Reginio, Joevy M. Talamayan, and Janice A. Gaduena started a whole day of training. The seminar was fast-paced, extensive, and grueling, given the wide breadth of lecture content, online and hands-on activity they had to learn, and the technical skills they needed to acquire.

In the current era, artificial intelligence and emerging technologies make our work much more accessible than earlier; document control management or archive management has become a value-added project management tool for current business. Due to COVID-19, we are moving towards business transformation management in digital control, where these tools will become necessary for any small or large business.

Mr. Romeo Ramirez, the Resource Speaker, gives a robust foundation for the profession and explains all the tasks and responsibilities of a document controller. It contains numerous workshops and tutorials that will acquire competencies and enables the participants from different constitutive units under the Philippine Public Safety College to achieve their goals of becoming effective document controller that can apply to day-to-day work. Most Document Controllers learn the discipline 'on the job.' The seminar consolidates the profession's foundation, formalizes knowledge, and deepens competencies. It allows experienced Document Controllers to compare their experience with best practices.

Any organization wanting to comply with the ISO 9001:2015 standard must produce certain documents, including a quality manual, a quality policy, and specified documented procedures. Of course, most organizations will choose to record much more information than that required by the standard. Controlling documents is a crucial requirement of ISO 9001:2015, and one documented procedure is the Document Control Procedure. The standard specifies that controls should be defined within the procedure; these explain further below.

The seminar points out to help the participants to meet the nine required areas of document control: Layout and Structure, Coding and Numbering Scheme, Review and Approval, Status Control, Version Control, Document Preservation Control, Distribution Control, Document Security Control of Obsolete Documents. First is the "Layout and Structure," which facilitates the identification of unapproved QMS documents and Guides compliance to requirements through predefined fields. "Coding and Numbering Scheme" pro-

defined fields. "Coding and Numbering Scheme" provides standard, logical, and traceable QMS docu-



ments. "Review and Approval" specify reviewing and approving authorities for each record and reviewing approved documents before issuing or re-issue. "Status Control" typical document control status identification: Stamp (controlled or uncontrolled), Dry Seal, and Color-coded papers for controlled copies. "Version Control" identifies the current revision status and denotes revision marks (Revision levels or Issue levels) or the latest release by date. "Document preservation control" document must remain legible, identifiable, and specify a method to recall and replace soiled, torn, physically deteriorated documents. "Distribution Control" documents are available and suitable where and when needed: Distribution defines who decides, who does it, who checks it, External defines who decides, who acquires, who distributes, and updates master lists to track down documents. In addition, "Document Security Control" protects documents and maintains confidentiality and integrity, prevents improper use, specifies accessibility policy outside of working hours, electronic copying or emailing policy, establishes policy for unauthorized changes, reproduction, disposal or issuance, establishes a system for issuing "uncontrolled" copies and assignments with prior authorization. Lastly, the "Control of Obsolete Documents" recalls obsolete documents, records the call if outdated copies were kept, specify a method of identifying outdated documents, e.g., rubber-stamped "Obsolete."

In general, to be an effective documents controller, they should understand the standard and document control requirements and procedures, establish them, review, and be familiar with the specified forms such as document change requests, master list, distribution list, issuance, and recall, safeguard the document control stamps -"Controlled", "Uncontrolled", "Obsolete", "Reference". Communicate and clarify with concerned offices/functions. Always exercise patience and diligence, but also be mindful of details and maintain compliance to document control policies and requirements. Document control plays a vital role from beginning to the end of a project to ensure the proper flow of documents. It is an essential process in the QMS. It controls and manages all maintained documented information in the system. If it fails, the QMS will crumble and also forget. The Document Controller is the gatekeeper of the supported recorded data of the QMS. The Document Controller's training, commitment, and competence are crucial to an effective document control system. Be sure and don't overthink your writing.

With the ongoing trend in modern delivery of training and education, NFSTI is preparing itself to adapt the new way of learning modalities through the use of technology. In response to significant demand, NFSTI asynchronous learning allows students to learn on their own schedule, within a certain timeframe. Asynchronous learning may also encompass a wide variety of instructional interactions, including email exchanges between teachers, online discussion boards, and course-management systems that organize instructional materials and correspondence, among many other possible variations. A huge advantage of online learning is that it is inherently easy to scale. The use of educational technology tools can begin to convert selected subjects to asynchronous modalities. Once created asynchronous learning you can push it out to as many people as you want and there are no scheduling challenges, geographic barriers, or device restrictions. These online programs will support the PPSC mission of serving another sector of society that's in charge of public safety and security.






DIGITAL FORENSIC INVESTIGATION COURSE LOGO



In terms of facilities, there was a need to improve especially in the infrastructure, renovation, and supplies inventory. NFSTI: My HOME away from home


